History of Share



1969 & 1970s The Beginning

- Established Share in 1969 to provide emergency support to neighbors in need; commitment to an all-volunteer organization
- Focused on family assistance (including food, clothing, furniture, financial), youth programs and transportation
- Supported 16 families with holiday gift baskets in the 1st year





1980s Growing core programs

- Focused on affordable housing and special needs of the senior population
- Expanded furniture program with addition of two donated trucks
- Expanded to provide supplemental food for one week; added fridges to offer fresh items; added truck for food drives
- Created Holiday Event / Program







1990s to present Expanding into new areas

- Added new programs for back-to-school supplies and refurbished computers
- Coordinated Emergency Financial Assistance with Fairfax County Services
- Expanded pantry to every Wednesday and Saturday morning, and 1st and 3rd Thursday for over 55 population
- 1,000 volunteer hours per month supported
 1,100 households with 3,000 members in 2023





Share's Vision: To positively impact the lives of our neighbors in need

Share's Mission: Share of McLean is an all-volunteer, community-based nonprofit that teams with individual donors and partner organizations to assist our neighbors who face food insecurity, economic hardships or related challenges



What is Share?

Share is an independent, nonprofit organization dedicated to helping low and moderate income neighbors alleviate food, clothing, and shelter insecurities in the McLean, Great Falls, and the Pimmit section of Falls Church areas

Who are our clients?

Share supports 1,100 households with over 3,000 family members. Our clients are economically distressed families and individuals, seniors living on limited pensions, impoverished immigrants, victims of spousal abuse, and the unhoused

How does Share receive funding?

Share receives no government funding; all donations come from individuals, local businesses, and faith-based organizations

What programs does Share have?

Share programs are led and supported entirely by volunteers

- Food & Clothing pantry
- Furniture distribution
- Technology distribution
- Back to School and Holiday programs
- Emergency Financial Aid / Family Assistance




























Want to help out?
